

BILINGUAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

Bilingual classes maintain the student's level of academic concept development while they are learning the English language. Courses are taught in the native language and English. The main focus is the student's acquisition of concepts. Bilingual classes in social studies, math, science, and required courses, such as communication studies and consumer education, are offered on a rotating basis. Courses rotate every other year so that students in the program can get all the content credit necessary for graduation. At the recommendation of the bilingual instructor, bilingual classes substitute for regular English-language content area credit.
