

**CITING A WORK FROM AN ONLINE SERVICE
AS REFERENCED IN THE MLA HANDBOOK FOR WRITERS OF RESEARCH
PAPERS ¹**

A WORK FROM AN ONLINE SUBSCRIPTION SERVICE

To cite a work from an online service to which our library subscribes (*e.g., CQ Researcher, eLibrary, First Search, Chicago Tribune, Proquest Platinum., etc.*) it is important to include as much information as possible.

Because internet sites and resources may disappear over time you may want to consider making a hard copy of the work.

Author's Last name, First name Middle initial (*if known*). "Title of the Article." Title of the Magazine Day Month. (*abbreviate the month as previously described*) Year: Page range (*if known*). Name of the database used (*if known*). The database used. The name of the library where you accessed the database, City., State (*abbreviate the State*). The Day, Month, Year that you accessed the database <The URL of the online services homepage/>.

EXAMPLE

Schaefer, Bradley E. "Meteors That Changed the World." Sky and Telescope Dec. 1998. Direct Platinum. Proquest. Wheaton Warrenville South High School Lib., Wheaton, IL. 2 Mar 2000 <<http://proquest.umi.com/pqdweb/>>

A WORK FROM AN ONLINE SCHOLARLY PROJECT, INFORMATION DATABASE, AND ENCYCLOPEDIA

Typical entries for referenced sources include:

The Author's Last name, First name, Middle initial (*if shown*). "Title of the article." (*if shown*). Title of the project or database. Name of the editor of the project or database (*if given*). Date of publication or latest update. Name of sponsoring institution or organization. The Day, Month, Year that you accessed the database <The URL network address/>.

EXAMPLES
